Predator Free Mt. Vic

Predator Free Mt. Vic is a new backyard trapping group, covering the suburbs of Mt. Victoria, Oriental Bay, Roseneath, & Hataitai. This community- led initiative is working alongside other Predator Free community groups around the city, to help bring back the dawn chorus to Wellington.

This work began with a small trapping group in the town belt reserve land of Mt Victoria. With the catchcry "Victory over Vermin", guidance and advice from Wellington City Council, and funding from the Rotary Club of Wellington, in just over a year they have cleared over 900 pest species, including 9 weasels. They've noticed a big increase in bird life already, with sightings of tui, kākā, and even kārearea/ ΝZ falcon becoming more We now want to broaden this protective circle out to include homes in the suburbs surrounding Matairangi/Mt Victoria, so have created this backyard group. For a small koha, we will be providing traps enclosed in child & pet safe trapping boxes, with lots of regular tips and support. We are very grateful that the Rotary Club of Wellington is keen to extend it's support to assist in the establishment of this

Week of Waste in Wellington

Each year, the average Wellingtonian sends 200kg of kerbside/domestic rubbish to landfill - one of the highest rates in the country. Meanwhile, our recycling rate is very low by national standards, and has even been declining.

As the year draws to an end, I would like to thank Mt Victorians for all their good work for



our community and the wider Wellington one. The Mt Vic Hub goes from strength to strength, the commitment shown by parents and teachers alike at local schools is inspiring and local residents work tirelessly on numerous projects that benefit our community. I hope that you have a restful break over the summer.

On a personal note, I am very grateful to our community for the support that you have offered my children and myself after a challenging year.

At the time of writing, consultation for Let's Get Welly Moving has started. This is in essence a plan on how to move private vehicles, buses, cyclists and pedestrians around the city. Disappointingly it has a strong focus on new roads with little impact on greenhouse gas emissions. It also continues to advocate for the idea of a 'bridge' or flyover at the Basin after it was defeated at the Board of Inquiry and High Court.

Scenarios developed come with a hefty price tag of up to \$2.3b. Furthermore, it does not have a wider view on how the city may develop in the future to accommodate more affordable housing, greens space and resilience to climate change and earthquakes.

Next year offers you the chance to have another say on the city's budget. I will be focusing on trying to deliver my campaign promises of more walkability, a more child centric city and strong action on climate change with a new fund to make Wellington more resilient.
