2018 is shaping up to be a big year with important issues for Government to tackle. In Wellington, one of the big issues is housing.

rental housing market Wellington is tight. My office has received over a hundred stories highlighting significant weekly rent increases by some landlords.

Landlords will increase rents from time to time but it needs to be fair and reasonable. The Government committed to increasing the supply of housing in Wellington and improving renter's rights.

Reading stories from Wellingtonians has confirmed how unjust a lot of the renting market really is in Wellington. It is very important that we address the inadequacies in renters' rights in New Zealand.

A lot of these issues will only be solved by changing the law to improve the rights of renters. The Government has this work underway. If you have feedback on aspects of tenancy law you'd like to see improved, let me know. In the meantime, we are chasing up a number of the cases that have been raised about rent increases and conditions.

Thank you so much for your support. Wishing you all the best for the start to what will be a big year.

Iona Pannett:

Well it has been guite a summer with record breaking temperatures. I hope that you have all managed to enjoy a good break over the holiday period. Housing continues to dominate the news and rightly so. The Council has made the provision of more affordable and safe housing a priority and there is clearly a need for it. The question is where will it go? Inner city suburbs like Mt Victoria have some planning controls and one of the issues that we will need to grapple with is are they The appropriate? city has experimented with high density housing here and in other heritage areas (with some local opposition) and allowed for medium density. question is what development is appropriate and where?

On the local front, there are a number of issues to resolve. Firstly there are plans to demolish the JR Reid and CR Dempsey Gates at the Basin Reserve. I alongside some of my colleagues have concerns about that so discussions are ongoing.

Flooding issues continue to be an issue around the Basin Reserve and CBD so a CBD stormwater management plan is being developed which will go some way to responding to this issue.

Traffic safety continues to be an issue for me, especially for the many kids who go to school in our suburb. Speed management money is being debated through this year's Long Term Budget. Slowing the traffic is a must for me if kids are to be really safe. A safe way to cross Marjoribanks Street would also be good.

What has the Mt Victoria Residents' Association been doing over December and January?

-We've submitted to the **Let's Get Welly Moving** project on what we

-We met with some of the parties affected by planned developments in Elizabeth Street, as well as W.C.C. planning staff, to seek to understand how decisions have been made there. We want to see residents living in welldesigned developments, of all sizes, that are sympathetic to the existing physical environment, as well as the people living around them. It's part of work ongoing to gain transparency into the Council planning area's workings and decision criteria;

What's on the plan for February?

- We're getting ready to speak to our previous submissions to the Greater Wellington Regional Council's hearing panel for water quality and stormwater;

-We're looking at the Wellington City Council's proposed land swap at St Gerard's monastery, to see what can be done to avoid any degradation of the area and surrounding views;

We're reaching out to other residents' associations to see where we can work together — initially over transport issues facing all of us.


