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A Word From Grant Robertson

Ngā mihi ki a koutou.

We are committed to preventing, reducing, and ultimately eliminating homelessness. To reach this goal, \$54 million is being put into supporting people at risk of homelessness. One initiative being funded is Sustaining Tenancies, where we are collaborating with DCM to help people keep their tenancies and avoid homelessness. This money is separate to our \$197 million Budget investment into Housing First, which provides long-term homeless people with a permanent home and support services they need. I am pleased we have been able to take this action.We have also announced our plan for a new Archives building. Right now, we hold our most precious national items in a building that is at capacity, leaking and needs earthquake strengthening. It is no longer fit for purpose. So, we've committed \$25 million to get consent and to design a better building for our Archives. It will protect our stories, heritage and culture for future generations. Residents may remember Council produced its own olive oil in 2005 from Mount Victoria's street trees: winning a gold medal in the USA. Council no longer prunes our fruit trees, many of which urgently need shaping. Tree maintenance is now restricted to the legal minimum. as there aren't resources to prune for fruit production.



The looming council elections will be particularly interesting with so many candidates. I know people are worried about our rates, with 50% increases projected over the next 10 years. Council needs to spend our money more frugally so that our liveable city remains affordable.I'm standing for reelection as a Lambton ward councillor, so when your voting papers arrive shortly after September 20, don't tuck them away for 'later' - make sure your vote counts! Victoria Bowling Club: A beautiful oasis in the centre of Wellington



Victoria Bowling Club proudly remains a centre of competitive bowls in Wellington which has sadly seen off other city bowling clubs like Thorndon, Kilbirnie, Vogelmorn, Berhampore, Terawhiti, Hataitai and Wellington.Sure, the club no longer has 4 greens, but the two remaining cotula greens are lined by a spectator embankment anticipating the high-quality bowls entertainment that takes place there. The greens are a real treat... thanks to the former greenkeeper who has been lured back to the club.

The club's competitive bowlers expect greens that enable competitive bowls. After all, Victoria has a record to defend - the Club has won a national title every year for the last 6 years running. Photos of 13 Centre Gold Star holders adorn the walls of the clubhouse. The club has a serious bowling pedigree.

Immediate Past-President and Green Superintendent Lou Newman is unapologetic. "I know that a lot of other bowling clubs put an emphasis on the social aspect of bowls ... on and off the green. We tend to attract members who want to play competitively ... to play against the best. They want to improve their game, and be the best they can. Bowls is no different than any other sport where people are motivated to play socially or to play competitively ... or both."Victoria has 90 full-playing members. '

"Every year in late September we hold the Victoria Invitation Pairs," says Lou. "Where 32 teams are invited to play in the tournament. . The tournament just keeps on getting better."

Social bowls aren't completely forgotten and the club also attracts a large number of corporate events - "It's a great spot for an event," says Lou."

However, socializing at the club wasn't so easy 30 years ago."Before amalgamation, the women weren't allowed upstairs to the bar," recounts Lou. "They had to get a male friend to buy them a drink and bring it downstairs! We've come a long way."

If you are in the neighbourhood pop by the club. Drive up Pirie Street, but if you end up going through the Hataitai Bus Tunnel you've not only upset the council, but gone too far. The club's right there at the tunnel entrance on the left.
