A follow-up on the Lockdown Reflection from June.

I am so grateful for the wonderful response to my wondering what people are doing & prepared to do, to reduce what we send to landfill from our side of the mountain. With so much support, what is ours to do will be no burden, and enable us to live lightly on Matairangi.

Next steps for now:

Compost:

- do you want yours collected once or twice weekly?
- or do you wish to have others contribute to your compost, or drop off yourself through:
 - MakeSoil https://www.makesoil.org/
- The Compost Collective or https://www.sharewaste.org.nz/

Soft Plastic:

If packages are split open to a flat piece, washed and dried, we will collect. Otherwise your household can recycle at these locations: https://www.recycling.kiwi.nz/store-locator

Plastics 3-7:

Can be collected for conversion to gas through a Levin start-up (collection only to control volumes).

Lids (Plastic & Metal):

Bottle tops, wine caps, milk lids etc..... we can collect, or you can drop off to The Mt Vic Hub or Sustainability Trust, Forresters Lane, more info here: https://sustaintrust.org.nz/our-recycling-programmes/lid-recyclinglce packs (ie from My Food Bag/Hello Fresh) Drop off on the doorstep at 2 Port St, or we can collect for use by an online cheese store.

Cardboard/Paper - currently a tad overwhelming.

Please keep recycling every second Thursday or donating newspaper to the SPCA. We need to set up wine clubs or tea parties for regular ripping/shredding sessions. Let me know if you wish to host. The shreddings will be turned into soil via the compost avenues above.

Jars - all known recipients of larger jars are currently inundated.

Jam sized jars (< 350 grams) are welcomed by the Fruit Collective. Clean, de-labelled, lidded jars can be dropped off to The Hub or can be collected.

Collection Fee's:

To prevent the above going to landfill, wonderful volunteers are happy to pick up on agreed days for a gold coin donation per pick-up, or \$10/mth koha to Innermost Gardens. All donations can be recorded, with a donation receipt for your charitable giving issued at the end of the financial year, if you require. Mt Victoria Olive Harvest 2020

On Sunday 21 June a group of 14 Mt Victoria residents came together to harvest what we could from the olive trees along our streets. Our good friend Colin Kelly from Innermost gardens provided some rakes and tarps and our volunteers brought with them their rakes, buckets, enthusiasm and energy on the day. Thinking the most we would get was some olives for brining (as we had left it quite late to harvest for oil), to our amazement we managed to harvest approximately 115kg of olives. They were all perfect for pressing to make olive oil, which surpassed our expectations. A small pressing facility in the Wairarapa (Pressing Engagements) pressed our olives for us. We have bottled around 16 litres of local oil. This will be used at community events and dinners over the coming years. It is always a treat to taste and to tell the storylof how it came to be.



Completing the Wellington Olive Cycle

Roger, from "Pressing Engagements" has come up with a unique use of the crushed olive waste – turning it into fuel. After they press the olives the waste is too oily to easily compost. So Roger has started drying and selling the crushed fruit pulp and stone (after a years drying) as briquettes. (See Photo)

This is a common practice in North Africa. It is hot, so best for charcoal or coal substitute, adding flavour to BBQ cooking and also perfect for open fires or wood burners.

Roger has very kindly given us a deal here at the Hub where we can sell a 5.5kg box for \$20 and 10% goes to Innermost Gardens. (Retail is higher).
