Wellington's Spatial Plan - Mt Victoria Historical Society

WCC has advised that it will start consulting on its draft Spatial Plan on August 10. This is an extremely important issue for Mt Victoria because it could affect the character of the suburb. Potentially, all of the Council's current scenarios could see removal of at least some protection for our historic housing stock. We could have apartments of more than 6 storeys dotted throughout Mt Victoria. The pre-1930s demolition rule has played a significant part in ensuring that Mt Victoria has retained the unique character it has, but at least two of the current Council scenarios put this at risk:

Scenario 1 (Inner City Focus) – would require removing the pre-1930s character protection across most of the inner suburbs, particularly in Newtown, Berhampore, Mt Cook and parts of Mt Victoria.

Scenario 2 (Suburban Centre Focus) – would require reducing the extent of the character areas, particularly around Newtown and Berhampore where high density housing is considere As background to the Plan consultation, Mt Victoria Historical Society is keen to understand how important residents think the historic character of our area is. We're going to conduct a door-to-door petition, starting about August 14th. Our members will be clearly identified. PREDATOR FREE MIVIC

Predator Free Mt Vic is a volunteer backyard trapping group that was established in late 2017. We have a network of 600 traps, and have caught over 1,200 rats & 1,400 mice since our establishment at the end of 2017, complementing the work of town belt trapping group Mt Victoria Vermin



Trappers, who since 2016 have trapped over 1,900 rats, 3,180 mice, and 23 weasels. We cover all the suburbs that surround the maunga of Matairangi/Mount Victoria, so everyone from Hataitai, Roseneath, Oriental Bay and Mt Victoria, supplying traps for people to set up in their backyards and help restore the native flora and fauna to our area. We're already seeing a massive increase in birdlife, with kākā now a common sight.

We're using easy set "T-Rex" rat traps that pass NAWAC humane guidelines, and these sit inside wooden boxes which protect pets and non-target species from the traps, as well as lining the pests up for a more humane kill. A word from Grant Robertson

Ngā mihi ki a koutou, The Prime Minister recently outlined what to expect if we have community transmission of COVID-19. Our border facilities have served us well, but with COVID-19 exploding globally, we must be prepared. If a new case is detected in our community, the Government would quickly apply strong restrictions, but only in a neighbourhood, town or city at first.Local measures would involve strict isolation of cases, and rapid tracing and testing of close contacts. We would scale up testing and target anyone connected to a case. If a big cluster emerges, the Government would quickly apply strong restrictions across a larger area. Much wider community testing would be prioritised, with a regional alert level shift likely to restrict travel in or out of the area. People there would be asked to work from home, and the size of local gatherings would be restricted.

If multiple clusters emerge nationally, the Government would quickly apply strong restrictions nationwide.Our goal in each scenario is to act hard and fast, but local, in an attempt to stamp out the virus – no one wants a full-scale lockdown.Our strategy is still to eliminate the virus. We cannot allow our hospitals to be overrun, more deaths, or our economy to shut down indefinitely. We've got a plan if we need it, but we're working hard to ensure that we don't.– Grant

also. We've submitted on a bunch of things – you can see them on our website. The standout activity for me over the last month was the carpark takeover we did outside BATS theatre, to coincide with their Midwinter Market. They approached us a while ago, to support them to convert a carpark into cycle parking. After months of no progress with the council, we decided to take some direct action. We set up a temporary bike stand, and diverted all the bikes that would usually park on the footpath, onto the cycle parking area, for the day.

Apart from the obvious benefit of removing impediments to pedestrians, it gave an opportunity for lots of conversations about the plans for the Golden Mile. We're hearing a lot of concern about the three options – make sure you submit by August 9th, or get in touch and let us know what you think.
